Open

Members to produce a club advert to be used for publicity of their club. Please include club name, meeting day / times / location and club contact email. **All text must be typed** but images can be free hand or computer generated. Your entry must be **A5 portrait size** and can be black and white or colour.

Competitions Schedule Cover for Cowpie 2026

Open

Create a design with the theme “Planets of the Solar System”. The title **Cowpie Competitions Schedule** and date **Sunday 14 June 2026** to be included.

Black and white, free hand entries only. Your entry must be **A5 portrait size**.

Cowpie Programme Cover 2026

Open

Design a colour cover for the Cowpie programme. The title **Surrey Young Farmers – COWPIE COUNTRY SHOW** must be included, along with date **Sunday 14 June 2026**. Computer or free hand may be used. Your entry must be **A5 portrait size**.

Make beetroot brownies. Display four on a plate and cover with cling film

Carrot muffins with cream cheese icing Class Senior & Advisory
Make carrot muffins with cream cheese icing. Display four on a plate and cover with cling film

Members will be required to draw in pencil, an item / or items provided. A4 paper and pencils will be supplied but members can bring their own. 20 min limit

You can also take part in County Competitions ... and may qualify to represent Surrey in SE Area & National finals

Speaking comps (10.30am to 1pm) will be allocated based on number of entries

Member of the Year – 18 & over – 17 & under from 10.30am

Synopsis form (template provided) to be emailed to County by Fri 23/01/26.

For 17 & under power point presentation emailed to County by Fri 30/01/26

Reading (team of 3 aged 14 & under) (**max 1 team per club**) 11:00am - 11.45am

Reading book is "The Boy who saved a Bear" by Nizrana Farook.

On the day three separate passages from the book will be given out at 10.30am to prepare.

Chair will introduce team and give brief background on book.

Auctioneering (up to 3 members per club) Valuation 10 – 10.30am

(20% of marks). Competitors need to value all six items and then select two items that they will auction and write a brief description for these two items.

Auction from 11am. Members will be allocated a time. They will have 5 mins to introduce their auction, describe and auction two items with audience bidding and then close the auction. At SofE show, the National rules will be followed.

Public Speaking (team of 3 aged 16 & under) from 11.30am

Team will consist of Chairman, Speaker and Proposer of the Vote of Thanks. Speaker to hand in subject notes by 10.30am.

Situation Vacant (aged 16 to 21 & 22 to 28) age as of 1/9/25 from 11.30am

Members to submit their CV (max 2 x A4 pages) and covering letter (1 x A4 page) for a job advertised in the last 12 months. Applications (including original advert) emailed to County by 23/01/26. On the day members will attend an interview for the job.

In the afternoon.....Sports outside if weather allows 12.45 - 1.15pm

Show Choir (County Competition – 28 & under). Max 10 mins 1.20 – 1.40pm

Between 8 and 20 singers, plus 1 choir master and 1 musical accompaniment.

Commercial Dance (County Competition – 28 & under) 1.40 – 2pm

Between 4 to a max of 12 dancers. Music must have been in UK top 40 Singles Chart after 1 Jan 25. Dance between 3 to 5 mins

Indoor Competitions Rally Rules:

1. Classes are open to all signed up members of Surrey Young Farmers' Clubs who fall into the following headings:

Junior Class: Members 14 years of age or under on 1/9/25

Senior Class: Members 15 to 28 years of age on 1/9/25

Open: Members 28 years of age or under on 1/9/25

*NB – For pre-entered competitions members may enter up a class i.e. a 13-year-old can enter the Senior class (but cannot enter both classes.). Members 15 and over (as at 1/9/25) cannot enter a junior class.

Entries on the day to be entered into the correct age class

2. Clubs may enter as many members as they wish in each class, unless otherwise stated.
3. No exhibit shall have been entered in a Surrey YFC competition before.
4. Members must ensure that there is a completed entry slip left with each exhibit (to be provided to clubs in advance and on the day).
5. The decision of the Judges shall be final. Judges' comments will be displayed after judging.
6. Scoring: 1st = 5 points, 2nd = 4 points, 3rd = 3 points, 4th = 2 points, 5th = 1 point. In addition, 1 point will be awarded per Club, per class entered. Only the top 3 entries from any one Club will be awarded points towards their Club total. Marks for Advisory and Associate classes will go towards the Advisory and Associate cup. Points in the Open events will count in the overall Club Scores only and not in the age group sections.
7. All exhibits must remain in place until after the presentations and then must be collected and taken away. Any exhibits left behind will not be kept. Early removal of exhibits may have up to 20 points deducted from the Club's overall score.
8. Young Farmers must exercise caution at all times and respect other members' exhibits and property.
9. Surrey YFC and all parties concerned shall have no liability for any claim whatsoever in respect of injury, damage, or loss of property.
10. Vandalism, rudeness, or disruptive behaviour will not be tolerated; any members found acting in this manner could have up to 20 points deducted from Club's overall score as well as appropriate disciplinary action being taken in line with NFYFC's Behaviour Policy.
